United Way's 2-1-1 is a free, multilingual service that refers callers to non emergency health and human services

When Coloradans need help finding emergency and non emergency human services resources including food, shelter, rent assistance and child care options, they can call Mile High United Way's 2-1-1. Available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week to help individuals with real-time resources in our community.

Referrals that can be made using 2-1-1:

- Licensed child care
- Rental/Utility Assistance
- Housing/emergency shelter availability
- Food/Clothing Banks
- Mental Health assistance
- Dealing with abuse/prevention
- GED/ESL classes
- Suicide Intervention/Prevention
- Medical Clinics
- RX Assistance
- Senior Services
- Youth Programs
- Support Groups
- Legal Assistance

** In special circumstances such as mass incidents or disasters- 2-1-1 may assist by setting up a separate set of operators to help with event specific referrals. When an individual calls 2-1-1, they may be prompted to push the option that refers to the special event/disaster**
